



Participants take part in academic taster sessions, speak to current students and receive advice on applying to university.

The programme will take place online with sessions weekly from 5.00 - 6.30pm on the following dates: **Monday 26th February, Monday 4th, 11th and 18th March, 2024,** with a planned visit to the University.

Free Year 12 University of Bristol Residential Summer Schools in 2024


Our <u>Insight into Bristol</u> and <u>Sutton Trust Summer Schools</u> are free residential experiences for Year 12 students. They both offer the opportunity to experience student life in the vibrant city of Bristol. Participants will stay in university accommodation and take part in academic seminars and social activities, supported by current undergraduate students. They will meet student societies and learn more about what university life is really like. The summer schools for 2024 will likely take place in July 2024.

Participants who complete the summer school will be eligible for a guaranteed contextual offer or interview from the University of Bristol. Contextual offers are set two grades below the standard offer level, meaning this programme is a great opportunity for students to access a highly selective Russell Group university.

Applications for both summer school open in January 2024. Students can now **register their interest** in Insight into Bristol (click <u>here</u>), which is exclusive for students who identify as Asian, Black or Mixed (featuring one or more of these groups) and the Sutton Trust Summer School (click <u>here</u>).

Did you hear about University of Hull Chancellor's Scholarship?

The Chancellor's Scholarship will reward 10 high-achieving students who have a great potential for academic excellence.

It will cover the full cost of their undergraduate tuition fees and will be awarded to 10 new University of Hull students per year, starting with 2024/25 entry and will run for three years.

Key Dates:

- * Applications are now open, and the application deadline is 31st January 2024.
- * Scholarship winners will be announced by the end of March 2024.



Key Criteria:

- * Applicants must be UK resident and qualify for Home fee status.
- * All undergraduate degree courses commencing Autumn 2024 are eligible with the exceptions of Foundation courses and Medicine.
- * Applicants will need to submit a written application (max 500 words) and a video (max 2 minutes) explaining why they should be considered.
- * A predicted grade of at least 128 UCAS points.
- * Applications will be assessed on multiple criteria rather than just grades alone. This includes a student's passion for their chosen subject, their overall communication skills and their plans to contribute to university life.
