A reminder about the school vaping policy and about use of the toilets:

Their use and possession is strictly forbidden on school grounds. If a student is:

- Caught using or in the possession of a vape a **Fixed Term Exclusion** will be issued.
- Part of a group where it is unclear who is vaping a **Head of School** detention will be issued. Should these develop into multiple offences then the **Exclusion** policy would be followed.

Use of school toilets

As you will be aware we have recently made changes to the availability of toilets with respect to year groups. This was in response to anti-social behaviour including vaping by a very small minority of students. In addition to out sanctions on vapes, if students are found to **be sharing a cubicle** this will result in **a Head of Year** detention. Students will also be searched for vaping paraphernalia Again, multiple offences may result in the **Exclusion Policy** being applied.

We are fully committed to ensuring that Sheldon is an inclusive community where all students feel safe and supported, vaping has no place in this community and will not be tolerated.


