

#### What is SOC?

Standard Occupational Classification (SOC) codes are the UK government's official method of sorting jobs into categories.

SOC4 sorts all jobs into 370 diferent categories, SOC3 has 90 categories, and SOC2 has 25,

Here's an example of how it works. The Unifrog careers profile 'Classical musician' goes into the SOC4 category 'Musicians', which goes into the SOC3 category 'Artistic, literary and media occupations', which in turn goes into the SOC2 category 'Culture, Media and Sports occupations'.





### The plumber-led support network keeping people warm this winter

As the cost of living crisis bites, a support network founded by a plumber is helping struggling households across the UK

S sperheroes come in many guises, some in capes, some equipped with elaborate gadgets, and others – like Burnley plumber James Anderson – carrying a wrench and blowtorch.

Anderson is the brains and the plumber's brawn behind <u>Disability and Elderly Plumbing and Heating</u> Emergency <u>Repair</u> - known as Depher - which provides a free and discounted service to people in need.

To date, Depher has helped over 19,000 people – and with a spiralling cost of living crists and winter looming, its vital lifeline is in more demand than over.
