Identify gaps. **Create** – make notes, revision cards, mindmaps, posters etc etc. **Test** – regular testing with revision cards, past papers, Seneca, Quizlet etc will move knowledge from short-term to long-term memory

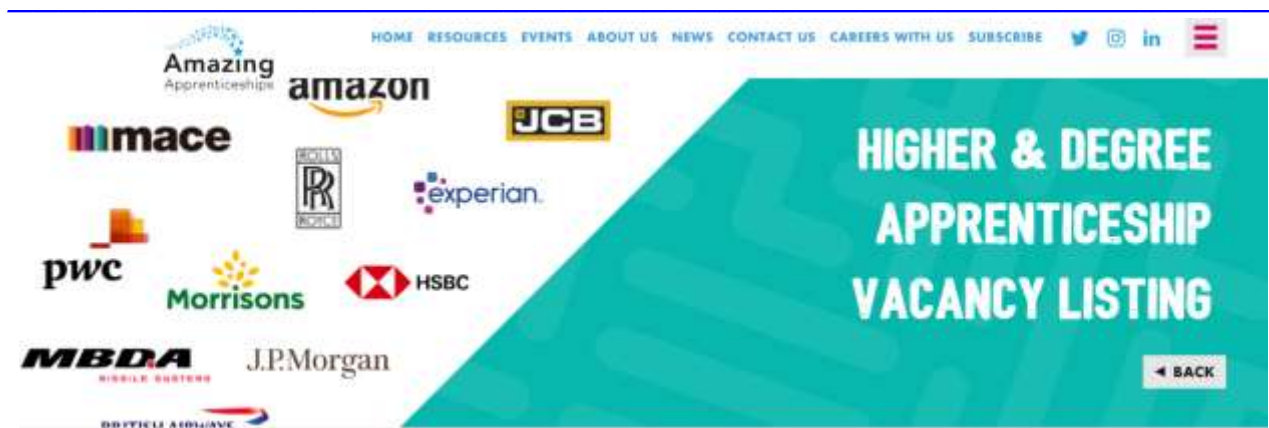
