Dear Parents and Carers,

It has been a rather wet Term 2 here at Sheldon and across Chippenham, and I hope that the floods haven't damaged your property or led to too much disruption over the recent weeks. After closing the school due to lack of water, lack of electricity and now too much water, I am starting to worry for what Term 3 will bring!

On the positive side, this has been another great term, with staff and students being extremely busy and getting into the festive spirit. We've had a fantastic term filled with visits from the BBC and Points West, who have been following the progress of our Ten Tors team as they prepare for their event this summer. They also joined us during our Children in Need fundraising events, showcasing the incredible efforts of our students. Through cake sales, non-uniform day, sports events, quizzes, and the ever-popular "sponge the teacher," the students raised an impressive £2,076.66. A huge thank you to everyone who contributed—your support and enthusiasm have made a real difference!

Student survey summary

Below are some of the key findings from our student survey conducted this term, which received an impressive 1,191 responses. We are delighted to report an improvement in nearly all areas compared to last year's survey. However, two areas were identified as needing attention, and these will be our focus over the coming terms:

- 1. **Movement between lessons**: Students highlighted challenges with transitioning between lessons, particularly due to our narrow corridors and older buildings. We are developing a plan to address this issue in terms 3 and 4.
- 2. **Perceptions of consequences for unkind behaviour:** Some students feel that the consequences for unkind behaviour are not effective enough or clearly communicated. We are reviewing our approach to sanctions and exploring how we can better communicate the outcomes of follow-ups with students, so they feel more assured.

Year 12 Parliament Trip

Christmas lectures at Oxford for Science students

On the 10 December, we took our Year 9 scientists to the Oxford Natural History Museum for the Christmas Lectures. The first lecture was on apex predators in the Amazon and the second talk was about secrets from the prehistoric world with lots of interesting facts about the dinosaurs and the role of palaeontologists. It was a wonderful way for our students to experience science outside of the classroom and expand their scientific knowledge.

Term 2 Sporting successes

It has been an outstanding term for extracurricular sport at Sheldon, with exceptional participation from students across all year groups. We've been particularly impressed with the consistent attendance at clubs and the enthusiasm shown by pupils representing the school.

Girls' PE Highlights

The Year 7 netball team had an incredible undefeated season, culminating in their well-deserved title as area champions. Our Year 8 and 9 teams also delivered impressive performances. The Year 8 team secured second place in their area tournament, while the Year 9 team lost just one closely contested match all season. In football, the U16 girls' team displayed phenomenal skill, scoring four times as many goals as they conceded. A standout moment was their emphatic 7-2 victory over Lydiard Park. Meanwhile, our KS4 badminton girls triumphed in their area tournament and are now through to the county finals next term.

Boys' PE Highlights

This term marked the introduction of an exciting inter-school varsity series with Hardenhuish. Each year group is competing in a three-match 'Test Series,' starting with rugby. As we approach the final games, keeping the competition on a knife-edge.

In rugby tournaments, our Year 7 and 8 teams secured second place, while the Year 9 team took the top spot. The National Cup football competition saw some notable success, with teams progressing to round 3 and the Year 8 team making it as far as round 5 before being narrowly defeated by last year's quarter-finalists. In the County Cup, all teams advanced past the first round, with the Year 8 team determined to defend their title in the next stages after Christmas. Sheldon also celebrated a significant win in the annual area cross-country championships, bringing home the trophy to sit alongside the area athletics trophy from the summer -a remarkable double achievement!

Additional Highlights

Our sports leaders and ambassadors have shone this term, dedicating their time and effort to supporting the PE faculty in organising events. The primary school tough mudder and cross-country events were particular highlights, showcasing their leadership and organisational skills. Year 11 core PE students completed a netball leaders' module, culminating in delivering sessions to Year 5 pupils at a local primary school – a fantastic experience for all involved. Finally, our Sixth Form Varsity saw fierce competition last week, with the Year 13s crowned champions after excelling in netball, badminton, volleyball, football, and hockey after beating Year 12.

Term 3 PE clubs will kick off on January 13th, and we can't wait to see what our students achieve next!
