#### Some reminders and answers to questions from week 1:

- Lanyards should be worn around your neck at all times whilst on site.
- Mon, Weds and Fri tutor times are compulsory for all students
- Yr12 = assembly week 1 and PE week 2
- Yr13 = assembly week 2 and PE week 1
- When you do not have assembly you should be in tutor and when you do not have PE it is a study session.
