Exam info	Component 1: Appraising music This component is 40% of A-level marks (120 marks). Component 2: Performance This component is 35% of A-level marks (50 marks). A minimum of ten minutes of performance in total is required Component 3: Composition This component is worth 25% of A-level marks (50 marks). A minimum of four and a half minutes of music in total is required.
