#### Attendance

There is an issue with communication between SIMs (our management information system) where registers are taken and ePraise. The issue arises from how study time is recorded and shared between the two platforms. We are working to resolve this and in the meantime please be assured that if there is a concern about your attendance your tutor or Head of Year will be in touch with your parents and will discuss this with you.

#### Yr12 study time

Following the recent Year 12 interim report, Year 12 students are now allowed to study at home during their timetabled study slots. However, the following rules and expectations apply:

- Monday, Wednesday, and Friday tutor sessions remain compulsory
- The default position is that we will assume students will stay at home during their study slots
- If students decide to come into school to study during their study slots, they must sign in with Mrs Coombs in the sixth form office.
- Tutor 1:1s, or requested meetings by staff, take priority over home study. Teachers have been asked to give plenty of notice to students if they want to hold a meeting.
- One-off presentations or directed year group activities take priority over home study
- Some students have been assigned supervised study slots due to concerns raised on their interim and/or concerns raised on e-praise. There will be letters going home to the students for whom this applies. If students show improvement, then supervised study will be reduced or removed from their timetable. Students will be added to supervised study if their attitude to work deteriorates at any given time.

We expect students to take a sensible approach to home study and maintain the required level of productivity needed to be successful at A level. Most students usually mix home study and in-school study based on their timetable structure and transport. We appreciate that some students cannot access home study due to travel restrictions. Unfortunately, we cannot resolve this in Y12.

#### **Remembrance service**

On Monday 11th, the silence will be at 11.11am (to avoid conflict with the end of break and start of period 3.) We will hold a ceremony at the flagpole from around 11-11.20am. Any free sixth form students are welcome to attend. Cadets, scouts etc are welcome to wear uniform and are welcome to attend the ceremony (after they have registered for period 3 and with their teacher's permission).

#### Yr13 exams

The letter on your timetabled lessons corresponds to the block so 13C/So1 is Sociology in block C so you will have exams Tues 19<sup>th</sup> lessons 1+2 and Thurs 28<sup>th</sup> lessons3+4. Other lessons will continue as normal. Students with access arrangements need to check these with class teachers NOT the exams office. We will accommodate, but check in with teachers to make sure you're sorted.
