

Yr12 study time

Following the recent Year 12 interim report, Year 12 students are now allowed to study at home during their timetabled study slots. However, the following rules and expectations apply:

- Monday, Wednesday, and Friday tutor sessions remain compulsory
- The default position is that we will assume students will stay at home during their study slots
- If students decide to come into school to study during their study slots, they must sign in with Mrs Coombs in the sixth form office.
- Tutor 1:1s, or requested meetings by staff, take priority over home study. Teachers have been asked to give plenty of notice to students if they want to hold a meeting.
- One-off presentations or directed year group activities take priority over home study
- Some students have been assigned supervised study slots due to concerns raised on their interim and/or concerns raised on e-praise. There will be letters going home to the students for whom this applies. If students show improvement, then supervised study will be reduced or removed from their timetable. Students will be added to supervised study if their attitude to work deteriorates at any given time.


